

Chrisitian Recording Artist and Worship Leader at Ezekiel Baptist Church

JERMAINE DOLLY, worship leader at Ezekiel Baptist Church, is an emerging Black gospel artist and part-time comedian. He sings tenor and falsetto, and plays piano and drums. After graduating from West Chester University, he began his career as opening act for Tye Tribbett, recorded with him on his "Greater Than" (2013), and was included in Tribett's anthology "Wow Gospel 2018." His first big hit, which brought him national attention upon its release as a single in 2015, was "You," called "a refreshing anthem to Jesus" by Blessing Harper of Jubileecast.com. It and another single, "Come and Knock on My Door," were featured on Dolly's only album as of 2022, "Dolly Express" (2017), which reached number one on Billboard's list of Top Gospel Albums. As of 2022 Dolly has had three subsequent singles at #1 on Billboard's Gospel Airplay charts: "Pull Us Through" (2020), "It's Gonna Be Alright" (2020), and "I'll Go" (2021, written 2011).



Accelerate Conference Breakout Sessions

We are so excited about this year's Accelerate Conference! We sense that God is doing something special in our midst.

Back in the spring, BRN's team of directors gathered to discuss what breakouts we should offer for this year's Accelerate Conference. We knew our keynote speaker would be Jeff Christoperson, executive director of the Canadian National Baptist Convention and Church Planting Canada.

Jeff, a missiologist, is the author of "Once You See: Seven Temptations of the Western Church," a book which drives readers to reflect on how God might be calling them to a richer, more fulfilling Christian life, leadership, and ministry. At the Accelerate Conference, Jeff will examine the seven temptations during his keynote addresses.

As we sat in our directors' meeting to strategize the breakout content, we weren't feeling very inspired. Then someone asked how many breakout rooms we had available. The answer was "seven." As in ... "Seven Temptations"!

Shannon, our director of communications, pulled out her "Once You See" book and started reading the temptations to the rest of the team. One by one, the directors excitedly shared the helpful, practical content that would match each temptation, which Jeff defines as the "very things that we often celebrate as marks of faithfulness, but might in reality be the very opposite." These temptations are areas where churches can be tempted to be more like western culture than the Bible.

These seven temptations of the western church include:

- Philosophicalism "We are a Bible-believing people."
- Professionalism "We have a gifted pastoral team."
- Presentationalism "Our worship is inspiring, and our preaching is strong."
- Passivism "Everybody is welcome."
- Pragmatism "We are one of the fastest growing churches."
- Partisanism "We love our country."
- Paternalism "We train pastors around the world."

Our Accelerate Conference breakout sessions seek to offer some of the Kingdom correctives to these seven temptations. Presenters were selected by their demonstrated experience in each of these areas.

Recently, we held a meeting with all the breakout speakers with Jeff Christopherson. Even in that meeting, we felt the profound presence of the Holy Spirit. All were moved. It is hard to explain what we felt, but suffice it to say we have great anticipation that God has good, good plans for us.

Jeff said that, in many ways, his book is a culmination of his lifetime of missiological learning, observation, and practice. His prayer is that it might be used for God's glory as He reveals His Kingdom through churches solely devoted to Jesus' mission. That is our prayer as well. May the Accelerate Conference truly help all of us accelerate Kingdom movement.



Bill and his wife, Rondie, have traveled extensively to train thousands of believers how to make disciples who make disciples.

LEAD PASTOR, RESTORED CHURCH, WILKES-BARRE

TIM WALKER is the lead pastor of Restored Church in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania, an urban church that he planted with a team of friends in 2012. Tim has led Restored to be actively involved and known as a church "In the City, For the City." Since launching, Restored has never had a Sunday without new people, they have now celebrated 175 baptisms, and they are pursuing a disciple-making movement that saturates their city and region with the gospel.

Tim also serves on the USA National Leadership Team for The Timothy Initiative, a global disciple-making, church-planting movement focused on multiplying disciple makers, leaders, and churches to the 4th generation.

Tim met and married his wife Heather at Restored. They've been married for eight years, have two girls, Lucy and Emily, and they love living on mission together as a family in Wilkes-Barre.

BRENNAN COUGHLIN is a church planter and preaching pastor at Fellowship CrossPoint Church in Chesterfield, New Jersey. After eleven years teaching history in New Jersey public schools, Brennan felt called to full-time ministry. He earned a master of divinity degree from Biblical Seminary in 2011, and in 2014, he and his wife, Kathleen, moved with their four children to Trenton to start a church in the capital city. The church began with a team of twenty sent out from Fellowship Community Church in Mount Laurel, New Jersey, and they met weekly in the Coughlins' home for Bible study. OUTREACH DIRECTOR, FELLOWSHIP CROSSPOINT CHURCH RUTH HUEBER serves the Lord in and out of the church, at Fellowship CrossPoint Church in Chesterfield, New Jersey, connecting the community to the love of Jesus. She also oversees KIDS Club and Hunger Stops With Us. Working with the interns, fellow staff members and volunteers to coordinate the growing ministry effort, Hueber said, "I have the privilege of helping kids understand who Jesus is and how they can be connected to Him."

She said she met Jesus when she was young, and it is really important to her that kids have an opportunity to hear about who Jesus is in a language that they can understand.

GREG DRAYER


BRN CHURCH HEALTH CONSULTANT (WEST)




JOSH COLDREN





CHURCH HEALTH

BRN's Church Health leaders share 2023 highlights



The Church Health team consists of Dr. Larry Anderson, BRN's director of church health and evangelism, and David Ludwig, BRN's associate director of church health and discipleship, and six consultants, spread across the BRN to serve the pastors and churches. They are Pastor Noelson Chery (ethnic consultant), Pastor Josh Coldren (Northern Central region), Pastor Greg Drayer (West region), Dr. Robert Fontell (Philadelphia region), Pastor Buff McNickle (South Jersey region), and Steve Sheldon (Southern Central region).

There were some great successes this year. Most notably, the BRN awarded a record number of grants for church evangelism projects. Also, the Advance Conference, featuring Dr. Nathan Lorrick, J.J. Washington, and Dr. Anthony Hurst, was a huge success this year. The BRN hosted several Pastoral Blessing events simply to encourage pastors and their wives. Additionally, David Ludwig has done much work in the area of revitalization (through the Transformation Pathway) and assisting pastors with succession planning.

Each of these church health leaders helped churches with their transitions, affiliating with the BRN, coaching (especially with new pastors and struggling churches), prayer and encouragement, and otherwise assisting churches in taking their next steps. Many focused on the areas of discipleship training, pastoral care, strategy development, welcoming of new pastors, pulpit supply, networking, spiritual health assessments, and so much more.

Josh Coldren, as our newest consultant, currently is introducing himself and building relationships with our churches. He will assist churches in taking their next steps.

In and around the Pittsburgh area, we have seen efforts made to bring our established church pastors and church planters into contact with each other. Many have gathered at hockey games, around the table, and even at Broadway shows and the Pittsburgh Zoo to enjoy fellowship.

In the Greater Philadelphia region, there were numerous churches that experienced increased baptisms, outreach events, and evangelistic block parties. Dr. Anderson and Robert Fontell met with regional pastors every Friday at noon for prayer and fellowship.

Steve Sheldon was available to celebrate the retirement and life events of Central Pennsylvania pastors and has come along several of them to celebrate and encourage God's work among them. Noelson Chery organized a pastors' breakfast for ethnic pastors and their spouses, among other events. As a result, these pastors recommitted to the BRN and are now more engaged than ever in each other's lives.

Buff McNickle also hosted a gathering with several South Jersey churches and their multiple leaders to discuss next generation leadership development. Some of the churches participated in the BRN Accelerated Internship these past two years. Other churches received help with VBS trainings and hunger grants. One newly affiliated church hosted a VBS and held its first ever Missions Week, where they engaged their community in several mission projects.

We thank God for His strengthening of churches throughout our region and look forward to the ways in which He will continue to grow His presence and Kingdom throughout Pennsylvania and South Jersey.



Six Practices of Disciple-Making

Disciple-making is not a program; it's a lifestyle. This is a big truth. Jesus said, "Follow Me and I will make you fishers of men" (Matt. 4:19). Clearly, this was no call to join a discipleship program but an invitation to a lifestyle of disciple-making. According to Jesus, this lifestyle is the supreme purpose of every believer. You cannot be a true follower of Jesus without becoming a fisher of men.

Common Misconceptions

There are some common misconceptions in today's church about disciple-making. Some think it is evangelism. It means having gospel conversations and seeking to lead others to Christ. Certainly, this is a vital part of disciple-making. But making converts is not the same as making disciples. You can do evangelism without being a disciple maker, but you cannot be a disciple maker without doing evangelism.

Others think disciple-making is Bible study. It involves great studies where people go deep into the Bible. Again, this is a vital part of disciple-making but there is a problem. Many participate in great Bible studies and then want to know when is the next one and the next one and the next one and the next one. We are making great Bible learners but not disciple makers.

Christ's Model

With no buildings or budgets, Jesus launched a disciple-making movement that exploded upon the world. In comparison, the church today has discipleship programs, but few disciple-making people. We must exchange our misconceptions about discipleship for Christ's model of disciple-making.

Jesus made disciples who made disciples; He didn't make any other kind. Apart from multiplication, there is no real discipleship. Multiplication is the key to reaching our world for Christ. However, most churches today lack a simple process for equipping believers to make and to multiply disciples. For the most part, we are attempting to reach the world by addition and we simply cannot keep pace.

By reading the Gospels, we learn there are six practices of disciple-making that Jesus modeled for us with His discipleship group. These include: 1) fellowship, 2) teaching, 3) prayer, 4) ministry, 5) multiplication, and 6) accountability.



COMMUNICATIONS

The Communications Team, comprised of Shannon Baker, Macala Mays, and Laurel Grimes, along with our wonderful summer intern, Celeste Brewer from Starksville, Mississippi, has had a very busy year.

In addition to producing weekly e-newsletters chock full of the latest news, testimonials, resources and events available to BRN churches, the team has completed several large communications projects.

Namely, we introduced the new "Your BRN Family" guide, which is a one-stop explainer of all the resources and opportunities available by

the BRN. We also produced the new #LovePASJ Grow Kit. which includes discipleship/leadership development guides, a prayer guide, a small group Bible study, spiritual health assessments, Scripture memorization cards, and so much more! In addition. there are video stories from various churches that flesh out this year's emphasis on intentional discipleship and leadership development. Several of these materials also are highlighted in our annual **#LovePASJ Week of Prayer** and Missions Offering, which churches typically celebrate in the month of September.

We've also produced all the media for our two conferences. the Advance Conference and the Accelerate Conference, as well as the weekly video highlights from Executive Director Barry Whitworth. Our team also does all the promotion and registration design for many of the 2023 events, including our conferences and workshops, Send Relief's Serve Tour Philadelphia, and our new First Steps Gatherings for new pastors and newly affiliated churches to the BRN.

We strive to make it as easy as possible for you to find what you need right away!





To get an idea of the enormity of the task, consider these following statistics: this year, we have already produced over 60 videos; added 18 new resources to our #LovePASJ kit; produced 34 e-newsletters and 10 Woven Women e-newsletters: produced 10 podcasts on "Celebrating Cooperative Missions"; designed a comprehensive guide to the BRN; and developed a whole new campaign to help our churches subscribe to BRN United. We are constantly updating our website, which is a busy job! Consider this: just for this Accelerate Conference, we have had 141 revisions (updates) alone!

The Communications Team also has been involved in several activities on a national level. Shannon continues to serve as a reporter for Baptist Press during their annual meetings. This

year, she provided coverage for several of the larger events at the New Orleans gathering.

Also, Shannon served as president of the Association of State Baptist Publications, an executive group of SBC editors. She was in charge of leading a four-day workshop in Hilton Head Island (held concurrently to the SBC Executive Directors' annual workshop). Her program was comprised of many of the SBC entity leaders and Phil Bowdle, author of "Rethink Communications."

At the April 2023 meeting of the Baptist Communicators Association, Shannon and Macala were featured on a panel discussion on mentorship. (See photo above.) Shannon also led an affinity group at the workshop, held this year in Ridgecrest, N.C. More recently, she and Macala served on a panel of judges who reviewed

entries for BCA's student award competition.

Shannon and her husband Larry also served as featured missionaries at the N.C. Baptists on Mission World Missions Conference in Ft. Caswell. N.C.

After serving out a term on a work study group with the SBC Executive Committee at the close of last year, Shannon was invited to serve on an independent group of SBC Cooperative Program advocacy leaders from across various state conventions to prepare prayer resources in commemoration of the Cooperative Program's 100th anniversary in 2025.

Even with all of this, it is true that our most exciting efforts have been capturing the stories of our churches all across our BRN family. We are so pleased to share and celebrate with you about what God is doing in your ministries. Please keep sharing!

COMPASSION MINISTRY

While there are many needs that exist in every community, we have found three strategic PATHWAYS that have the potential for us to do the most good and produce the most fruit in our region. They are in the arenas of Education, Food Insecurity/Poverty, and Triage/Trauma. Each of these PATHWAYS have several ways that you and your church can mobilize to help meet needs in your community.

Education: There is a myriad of opportunities tied to the discipline of education, such as supporting local schools and their students, faculty and staff, teaching English to international residents, or offering computer classes for the disenfranchised.

Food Insecurity/Poverty: There are families around us who lack consistent access to enough food and other basic essentials. Churches can meet these physical needs and their spiritual needs.

Triage/Trauma Ministry: When a crisis comes (whether a natural disaster, a crisis pregnancy, or abuse), churches can be on the front lines to help through disaster relief, counseling, chaplaincy, and more.

Much of our work this year, in relationship with the #LovePASJ SHOW initiative, has been in developing these arenas.

Also, we are excited to announce that the Send Relief SERVE TOUR PHILLY has been an incredible catalyst for us as we seek to see God move throughout Pennsylvania and South Jersey. We don't want it to stop here. Moving forward, the BRN will work with our churches to partner together at different cities in our regions to identify and meet needs so that we can take the gospel there to meet those needs collectively as we work together. Our first city will be ERIE, Pa., on Aug. 2-3, 2024. Stay tuned for all the exciting details through the BRN UNITED.

We are so thankful for all that God has done over this last year with Multiply Pennsylvania/ South Jersey. The goal of this strategy is to help churches move to the multiplication of new disciples, leaders, ministries, and churches. We have a goal of establishing 70 Multiplying churches.

Last Fall, we had three regional gatherings to share this vision. During these times, we began to lay the foundation for where we are going together.

In the Spring, all the regions came together to collaborate further and hear from one another. As we met

in State College, God met us there, and we heard from incredible leaders like Dan Nold, John Cope, and Dr. Larry Anderson. It was such a sweet time of prayer, worship, fun, and learning.

We continue to build out this strategy by gaining new insights with those who are part of this on how to make it better. We are also inviting like-minded leaders to consider partnering with

us to further advance this vision. We believe when we get multiplication right, it will allow us to change the score card of lostness and to create a disciple-making movement that will change the landscape of Pennsylvania and South Jersey.

We continue to put in front of these what

we are after, what reproducers and reinvesters are, and what the pathway is to help them take their next step.

Reproducers are churches that have indicated or shown the capability of reproducing new disciples, leaders, ministries, and new are reflecting and possibly modeling

churches. The churches

Reinvesters are churches that have reached a level of growth to where they are contributing through dynamic biblical behavior the kind of movement (moving and leading out) that contributes to the growth and advancement of the Kingdom within the BRN and beyond.

DISASTER & CRISIS RELIEF

Southern Baptist Disaster Relief (DR) is one of the top disaster response organizations in the world because we are able to quickly deploy well trained and experienced volunteers to the point of need and provide logistical support for them. Many disaster relief organizations serve only a humanitarian purpose, but that is not us. We are compelled by Christ's love for all mankind AND his desire that no one should perish. We keep our focus by nurturing our individual relationship with Jesus Christ in the context of a local body of believers who recognize and call out our giftedness in service to God and our neighbors.

WHAT WAS ACCOMPLISHED IN 2023 SO FAR:

We deployed to two disaster responses to date this year, in Barre, Vermont and Reading, Pennsylvania, where there was major flooding. We sent the Rapid Response Kitchen, Command/Communication Unit, NE Recovery Unit, Water Purification Unit, Fuel Trailer, and a generator to Barre. A Shower/Laundry Unit and the DR van went to The Bridge Fellowship in Reading. We had seven volunteers in Vermont. We had 19 volunteers involved in Reading plus 16 more from Ohio (6), Missouri (1), and Louisiana (9). This response included housing out-of-state traveling teams at Dallas Baptist Church, Legacy Church, East Shore Baptist Church, and the Volunteer House. We are holding our breath for the next two months, as it is hurricane season.

FOR EXERCISE/EVENTS: We did the Kitchen Management Training with the Red Cross at West Chester University, the Emergency Preparedness Fair at Allenwood Federal Penitentiary, The Pennsylvania Department of Human Services Expo in Harrisburg, supported the Civil Air Patrol Camp (at PEMA's request) with a Western Shelter. These involved 33 volunteers from our churches.

LOCAL CHURCH SUPPORT: Two Shower/Laundry Trailers at Nebo Baptist Church in support of the Restored construction project, a Shower/Laundry Trailer at Country & Town BC (twice) and Colonial Hills Baptist Church for mission team support, and the Rapid Response Kitchen and a Western Shelter to Plaid Community Church to support their community event. These involved 25 volunteers from our churches.

Each of these involved, in multiple capacities, trained and untrained volunteers from our churches.

LEGACY

At the end of 2022, the BRN launched the Legacy Initiative. This initiative focuses on how we all can join hands to make an eternal impact through the legacy that we leave on this earth. Everyone wants to have a life with meaning and impact. Part of that meaningful life is to live in the memory of family, friends, and even ministry partners. Generous giving with eternal impact can indeed create a legacy for families and Kingdom ministries that gives added meaning to your life and can continue after your chapter has ended.

In 2023, we brought on Chuck Knox as the BRN's Legacy Coach. He is working to create awareness in churches about the importance of wise stewardship, particularly stewardship related to end of life matters. Chuck has been leading Legacy Workshops across our region helping the people in BRN churches to understand the importance of preparing for the future and unpacking the estate options available. Along with this workshop, the BRN is able to provide each participant with a free simple Will as a way to help the participant to be a prepared steward. CONSTITUTION & BYLAWS PATHWAY

We have also been at work with the BRN's legal counsel to develop a church constitution and bylaws pathway. This pathway is designed to provide a general overview and understanding of what a constitution and bylaws is while instructing the reader to know what items should be included in these documents. As it is a pathway, it is designed to walk the church through a season of assessment, prayer, and intentionality. The document contains the basic legal and structural pathway for churches to walk through for either the creation of a constitution and bylaws for a new church start or an established church revising its documents. Part of the pathway provides a sample structure for the documents, and the church needs to tailor certain sections to their specific situation. As we have rolled this out to churches and church plants, it seems to have proven very helpful to them.

ONLINE GIVING

Also in 2023, the BRN rolled out a new online missions giving platform. Though the BRN has offered online giving options to churches for over 15 years, we felt the need to provide a more robust and user-friendly platform. We hope that this new platform has been a blessing and a help to those churches giving online. We are so grateful for your church's giving to the Cooperative Program, the unified giving plan that allows missions to take place in Pennsylvania, South Jersey, North America, and around the world. NEXT GEN MINISTRY



PENNSYLVANIA/SOUTH JERSEY has approximately 750,000 students on about 225 campuses, one of the largest student populations in the nation. We currently have about 15 vocational campus ministers serving across our region on 13 campuses, accompanied by a number of short-term workers, plus a number of churches that are reaching out to the campuses within their context. We also acknowledge the importance of ministering to middle and high school students who comprise the next generation.

Over the course of the past year, collegiate reaching and engaging the Next Generation across Pennsylvania and New Jersey has continued to expand.

Highlights of this past year of cooperative ministry include the following experiences and outcomes:

- Over* 1,473 collegians were evangelistically engaged through the collective work of the seven missionary families reaching collegians across our region. (*This reported number reflects only annual data submitted by MSC Self-Funded BRN Missionaries. The balance of activity for this metric represented by church-based and collegiate church plants in particular are not reflected in that number.)
- 26 collegians went on short-term missions opportunities for either their spring break or summer recess to engage in evangelistic and community focused ministry across our state and in foreign countries.
- After a pandemic-induced short hiatus from in-person conferences and retreats, we held our Fall Collegiate Conference at Camp Hebron. 68 Students and their campus ministry directors and missionary leaders shared together this weekend of discipleship, fellowship and recreation.
- The Lord has added two interns [Caroline Cunha and Maria Bartolucci] serving in the Philadelphia region with Brady Rennix (MSC Collegiate Missionary), as well as one full

time (MSC Funded) associate collegiate missionary [Rebekah Gulledge] to serve alongside Brian Musser. This brings the total number of collegiate reaching missionaries and interns in the Philadelphia region to 6—to say nothing of the many other collegiate church planters and church based ministries across Southeast PA near Philadelphia who have also expanded their staffs as well.

serve with the PA/SJ state convention, would be eliminated on July 31, 2023, effectively ending my 22-year career as a funded missionary with NAMB. While many others knew this was coming, I and my family were completely blindsided by the news and its significant implications for how we do basic life stuff while answering the upward call of God to serve the next generation. I am grateful

Looking forward to the coming year, we anticipate God's continued blessing and the outpouring of His Spirit. The most significant undertaking we will continue to establish is the Next Gen Missional Engagment Quotient of our network of partnering churches. Shane Pruitt's words from Accelerate 2022 continue to remind us that over 95% of those who trust Christ do so BEFORE they reach the age of 30.

Let's partner together to prioritize our resources of time, talent and treasure to speak the hope of life and light of truth from the gospel into the most significant window of openness and opportune witness while it is our privilege and charge to do so.

On a personal note, almost 90 days ago (July 5, 2023), I was informed that my role as a North American Mission Board (NAMB) missionary through which I have been funded to for the advocacy of Dr. Barry Whitworth, our state executive director and the generosity of Dr. Kevin Ezell, president of NAMB, who worked together to provide substantial funding with which I can continue to serve as our state convention's team leader on a time specific contract basis pursuant to raising support going forward.

My predecessor Dr. Robert Turner began this work in PA/SJ over three decades ago as a self funded missionary. Hopefully, its future will be as faithfully resourced as its beginnings were. In either case, I hope you will remember me and my family in prayer.

Over the past year we



That's right, the Lending Library contains Bible studies and ministry resources for everyone, not "just" women. We hope that this library will be a blessing to all of you.

We also met with many women virtually, via phone, and in person, and had many text chats as well. The best part of this position is meeting all the godly, beautiful women God is using to do His work across the BRN region. I've learned more and been blessed more by these meetings than I think any of the individual women we've met have been.

When I say "we" during this report, I want to convey that I am referring to my right-hand woman, my primary volunteer, Debbie Knowles. She is always Spirit-led and has her finger on the pulse of all things Woven Women. An avenue through which North Carolina Baptist churches, associations, and individuals have opportunity to partner with Pennsylvania/South Jersey congregations, church plants, and ministries in fulfilling the God-given task of reaching the lost for Christ.

NC Partnership teams have served all around the world in many different ways: **Bible School New Construction**

Backyard Bible Clubs
Community Surveys
Revival Teams
Youth and Children's Camps
Music ministry

Landscaping and cement work

Leadership Training ...And More!

The purpose of a NC Partnership team is to partner with you in reaching your community for Christ. This could include a direct ministry such as a Backyard Bible Club, sports camp, evangelism, and other outreach activities – OR - one that better equips your church *for* ministry – such as leadership training or facility construction or renovation.

NC Partnership teams pay their own way to the field. They are also prepared to pay their own housing, transportation, and meals *if necessary*. If it's possible for them to stay in your church facility and/or for your church to provide one meal a day for them – that helps greatly, but is not required. Also, evangelistic outreach teams are willing to bring ministry supplies if needed. Construction and renovation-type teams usually expect materials to be provided by the requesting church or organization – although on occasion, they may be willing to contribute toward materials if needed.

Pray about how you might use a volunteer missionary team to assist you in fulfilling your ministry. Fill out one (or more!) of the enclosed NC Partnership Volunteer Request Forms. Send the form to Mark Abernathy, Baptists on Mission (BOM) or Dewey and Kathie Aiken, NC On-Site Coordinators. We will be glad to receive requests throughout the year, but most of our churches begin their missions planning 8-10 months in advance, and will be eager to see a list of requests beginning in October. So please submit the request as soon as possible.

Baptists on Mission will work to promote your project among our churches here in North Carolina (and beyond via our website!) and help find a team to fill it. While we cannot guarantee a team to fill your request, we will promote it throughout the year in a variety of ways. When a team shows interest, the team leader will be put in direct contact with you. If you both feel it is a good fit, you both will set the dates of service and work out all the necessary details.

A BAPTIST RESOURCE NETWORK GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ACCELERATE CONFERENCE: The Baptist Resource Network's annual gathering, held each autumn, provides inspiration, training, and encouragement to churches. The conference also hosts a short business meeting to highlight accomplishments and vision.

ADVANCE CONFERENCE: The Baptist Resource Network's annual evangelism conference.

AMPLIFY CONFERENCE: This annual conference focuses on evangelizing, engaging, and equipping the next generation.

ANNIE ARMSTRONG EASTER OFFERING (AAEO): An offering held around Easter to support the field work of the North American Mission Board.

ANNUAL CHURCH PROFILE (ACP): Also known as the annual letter, this is the annual report sent from the local churches to the state convention.

BAPTIST FAITH & MESSAGE (BF&M): The list of beliefs held by Southern Baptists.

COOPERATIVE PROGRAM (CP): Southern Baptists' unified plan of giving through which cooperating Southern Baptist churches give a percentage of their undesignated receipts to support cooperative missions and ministries in the BRN and the SBC.

ETHICS & RELIGIOUS LIBERTY COMMISSION (ERLC):

A national entity who addresses specific moral issues in broader cultural conversations.

GREAT COMMISSION BAPTISTS: Great Commission Baptists, affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention, seek to follow God's command to make disciples of all nations.

GUIDESTONE: A SBC entity who provides health insurance, life insurance, retirement accounts, and taxation information as well as wellbeing resources for churches.

INTERNATIONAL MISSION BOARD (IMB): The missionary sending agency of the SBC that deploys outside of North America.

LEGACYPASJ: A fund began in 2021 with the assistance of Ministry Trust (theministryfund.org) to support the Baptist Resource Network's long-term viability.

LIFEWAY CHRISTIAN RESOURCES: The publishing house of the SBC, Lifeway is one of the world's largest providers of Christian resources.

LOTTIE MOON CHRISTMAS OFFERING (LMCO): An offering held around Christmas to support the field work of the International Mission Board.

NORTH AMERICAN MISSION BOARD (NAMB): The missionary sending agency of the SBC that deploys in North America.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION (WMU): A missions education, prayer support, and involvement organization that also promotes the Annie Armstrong and Lottie Moon offerings.


