

Notes for the January – August 2024 Financials:

1. The BRN team has worked closely with the Executive Board and Executive Board Leadership Team to advance forward through several high inflation years.
2. We rejoice that cooperative missions giving through the Cooperative Program is 6.4% ahead of this same period in 2023.
3. Global missions funding increased by 13.5% from this time in 2023.
4. All expense areas in 2024 are operating below budget to date.
5. The BRN's 2023 Financial Audit, by an outside auditor, was successfully completed with accompanying financial statements. The review showed sound financials, investments, and financial practices.
6. Thank you for your generous giving to the Cooperative Program, the unified giving plan for missions! As your church gives to Cooperative Program know that it fuels the acceleration of Kingdom movement for God's work in Pennsylvania/South Jersey, the nation, and the world.

Excerpts from the Baptist Resource Network's Constitution & Bylaws

Relating to Messengers and Voting

ARTICLE IV-MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1

The BRN shall have members. Members shall be churches that are defined as cooperating Baptist churches and have been approved for membership with the BRN. Churches desiring to be members and the removal of churches shall be evaluated in accordance with procedures outlined in the BRN Policy Manual.

To be eligible for membership, a church must meet the definition of a cooperating church which is a church that:

Regularly contributes to the Cooperative Program (CP),
Affirms in belief and practice the most recent *Baptist Faith and Message* ·BFM· as adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention in Annual Session, and
Regularly completes the Annual Church Profile (ACP).

SECTION 2

The BRN shall allow member churches to participate in the voting affairs of the BRN's Annual Session.

Member churches shall send messengers to the Annual Session to act on behalf of the member church. To be sent as a messenger, the individual must:

Be a member or active participant in good standing of the sending church, and
Personally affirm the most recent BFM in belief and practice.

SECTION 3

The number of Messengers selected by their respective churches shall be according to the following criteria:

- (a) A cooperating member church during the BRN's fiscal year preceding the Annual Session and/or during the current year is entitled to three (3) messengers.
- (b) Additional messengers from a church, up to a maximum of twelve (12), are authorized as follows:
One additional messenger for each fifty (50) resident members reported in the ACP, not including members of chapels/missions.
One additional messenger for a seven percent (7%) contribution to the Cooperative Program, and an additional messenger for each percentage point beyond that (indicated by a comparison of undesignated gifts reported in the ACP with BRN fiscal year receipts).
- (c) A mission not yet constituted shall be entitled to two (2) messengers in addition to the messengers of its sponsoring church.

SECTION 4: Removal of Messengers

If it becomes known that a messenger is not acting in accordance with the BFM, in faith and/or practice, such messenger may be removed in accordance with procedures outlined in the BRN Policy Manual.

ARTICLE VI-MEETINGS

The BRN shall have an annual gathering which shall include member churches. At this gathering the messengers of member churches shall participate in the BRN annual business portions of the gathering. The annual business portion of the gathering shall be known as the Annual Session. The BRN will determine the meeting location, date, times, and other meeting details. In case of an emergency, the President, with the consent of the Executive Board, may call a special business meeting.

BRN Office of President

Duties of the BRN President as defined in the Constitution and Bylaws:

1. Annually, the President shall be nominated by the BRN Executive Board and presented to the messengers in Annual Session. This officer role shall be elected annually by at least a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting at the BRN Annual Session. If the nominated candidate is not affirmed by two-thirds vote, the BRN Executive Board will request a re-vote or present another candidate.
2. The President shall preside over the Annual Session. The President may appoint other committees when requested by the body. In the event of the President's disqualification of incapacity to serve, the Vice President shall succeed in order. The President shall oversee the BRN's rule of order at the Annual Session and any Special Called Meeting.
3. The President of the BRN shall be the Executive Board President and serve on the board.
4. The President shall chair both the Administrative Committee and Executive Board Appointment Committee.

Video, BRN Annual Update, Barry Whitworth, Executive Director/Treasurer

We closed 2023 with 286 affiliated churches, but as of September 1 of 2024 we now have 313 churches

In 2023 the BRN staff made 6945 connections with pastors, churches, and partners
As of September 1 of 2024 we have made 4,173 connections with our pastors, churches, and partners

So far in 2024 we have given 46 ministry grants totaling \$46,515, a Serve PA/SJ grant totaling nearly \$32,000 and 113 Evangelism grants totaling \$118,060; this includes evangelism grants to 81 churches, 13 church plants, and 15 campus ministries

So far this year we've had 12 pastoral blessing events and have blessed over 60 pastors and their families

The BRN Guest House has been used by 8 pastors and their wives since the last Accelerate Conference

Also 25 groups utilized the Volunteer Mission House in Harrisburg, not counting the individuals and small groups that stayed one to two nights while traveling for disaster relief work

Despite being closed for most of the summer for renovations, another 18 groups, including the teams who worked on the house, utilized the Warren Mission House in Pittsburgh

This year 6 Guidestone mission recipients received a 13th check from the BRN
Two BRN churches also gave gifts to Mission Dignity through the BRN

The BRN also provided additional Guidestone benefits for 81 pastors

We had 15 individuals serve alongside our churches within our accelerated internship program this year

In our PA/SJ effort we had 294 volunteers from 27 BRN churches and 8 other churches and organizations participated in our Serve Erie missions effort last month and 5 other churches who piloted a mission month initiative this summer

According to our data collected through the 2023 Annual Church Profile (ACP), there were 1602 baptisms recorded last year, a 61% increase in baptisms over 2022, which is 1 baptism per every 12.8 members

There were 31,234 ACP reported Sunday morning attendees and 20565 members in our churches

As of September 1 of 2024, our team had 192 Next Step conversations with churches and 34 churches have completed their next step

Overall, 112 total individual churches have taken their next step on our way to BRN's 150 individual church goal

We have recorded 181 next steps taken overall, this is because some churches have taken up to five next steps

Nominating Committee – Pastor Buff McNickle

Report – churches are represented on the Executive Board, each region, based on certain criteria are represented; Pastor Rob Sheldon and Pastor Ken Sachs were presented to fill open positions on the board

Dr. Brian King opened the floor to discussion for nominee Jason Hunter

Questions and Vote – Motion was passed to appoint Jason Hunter as Board President

Everyone was encouraged to take out their phones and answer the questions online, then Dr. King read the questions and answers to the group

Video, Cooperative Program – created by Communications Director, Shannon Baker

- Asks the individual churches to fund ministries, which was adopted in 1925
- Through your church, a portion of what God provides, goes to the CP
- Reaches people in your state and around the world
- This amount is sent to the BRN to be shared locally, nationally, and internationally
- Messengers at the BRN annual business session from your church and other churches decide what percentage of CP gifts stay here to support local missions and ministries
- Messengers also decide on the percentage to be forwarded to the SBC for North American and International Missions and ministries
- The BRN uses their percentage of the CP funding for ministries such as:
 - Church servicing
 - Resourcing

- Coaching training
- Disaster and Crisis Relief (DR)
- Multiplying church centers
- Next Generation
- Partnerships
- Pastor/Staff benefits and more

Attends a small church that is a re-plant, from which the Lord has raised up 2 missionaries to go across the world; their salary, benefits, everything is taken care of through other churches partnering in the Cooperative Program; 600 church planters all across the country; chaplains serving in our armed forces; disaster relief, second to none, offering help across the southeast, devastated by Hurricane Helene; SBC provides a 50% discount to pastors and missionaries as they come and prepare in our seminaries; today we say thank you and ask you to continue and to go back to your churches and thank them and teach them about the Cooperative Program. Our small churches coming together, giving, praying, sending, going, accomplish more for God than we could do on our own.

Brnunited.org/budget25 – we have had our best financial year ever; CP giving is the highest it's ever been

Presentation of current BRN Financials – page 2 in our Accelerate program was highlighted to point out the financial report from Jan-Aug 2024

We are increasing the amount of money being sent forward out of PA/SJ to the national CP by 1%, this moves us from 33% to 34%, in 2025 we will be on track to be sending 34%; our resources are helping to keep over 3,000 IMB missionaries on the field; we are proposing a 4.6% increase for 2025, half of which constitutes the increased giving toward the national CP program; this budget is pointing to 37.7% to fuel BRN operations

Presentation of 2025 Annual Budget – Dr. Coughlin proposed the budget for 2025
Questions and Vote – a motion was brought to the floor to approve the 2025 budget, motion was carried

Video, IMB Report – Paul Chitwood

The gospel work that was done over the last year reached 155 countries

We worked to address the world's greatest problem – lostness
Through your church's giving through the Cooperative Program and the Lottie Moon Christmas offering, southern Baptists are sending and supporting almost 3600 IMB missionaries sharing the gospel around the world along with the 2700 missionary kids who are part of those families
Through your support, you have contributed to the IMB's work of sharing the gospel face-to-face with nearly 500,000 people and accompanied by our digital engagement strategy, over 1,000,000 people
In response to hearing the good news, 141,000 people around the world professed faith in Jesus

God's not finished with us yet. Philippians 1:6 being confident of this, that He who started a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus
This was the last time Dr. King spoke in his role as President
Working with us all has enriched his life and his ministry
God has done remarkable things in our convention since 1958
BRN PA/SJ has over 300 churches participating in the BRN, despite all that growth, God is not finished with us yet.
The message in Philippians was written for all of us in Christ
God is not finished with us yet, so let us serve boldly
Hebrews 4:16 let us come boldly to the throne of our gracious God, there we will receive His mercy, and He will find grace to help us when we need it
God sent Jesus through grace, mercy, kingdom and love, the fullness of God in him preached, raised the dead, cast out demons, fed 5,000, changed water into wine, outsmarted the religiously right, after 3 1/2 ministry Jesus was tried, spat on, nailed to the cross, hung between two sinners and cried out God, forgive them, and told the one beside him that he would be with him in paradise, He then bowed his head and

died. He was in the grave all Friday afternoon, all Friday night, all Saturday and part of Sunday morning, but before the rooster could crow, the Son got up from the grave. At the BRN, we have a clear vision of wanting to see every church within our Pennsylvania/South Jersey geography become a healthy, multiplying church.



OF 'GOD-SIZED ASSIGNMENTS' AND THE TWO FAITHFUL WORKERS BEHIND THE PLOW

Dr. Barry Whitworth, executive director of the Baptist Resource Network, and his wife, Beth, reflect on 20 years of ministry in Pennsylvania/South Jersey and all they have witnessed the Lord do in their lives and in our region.

The circumstances were divine in nature. The church they started in western New York, close to Buffalo, was thriving. Baptisms were happening one after another, the church was growing, and the community was vibrant. Surely, for Dr. Barry Whitworth and his wife, Beth, this northern nook would be where their legacy would last.

But others were not convinced.

"It seemed to be there was one situation after another where people were asking me to consider doing something else," recalled Barry Whitworth.

Ignoring these well-intentioned suggestions, Whitworth carried on with his ministry in the Buffalo area. That is, until he received a phone call from Dr. Stan Smith, who was, at the time, acting state missions director and associate executive director for the Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey (now known as the Baptist Resource Network of Pennsylvania/South Jersey).

On the other end of the line was, yet again, another optimistic suggestion to shift ministry roles – but this time in a different state.

Smith eagerly relayed to Whitworth his proposal: Come and lead a region in Pennsylvania as a church planting strategist.

Feeling prompted by the Lord to no longer ignore this call to something new, paired with Smith's undeniable persistence, led Barry and Beth to pack up their lives

in New York and head south to Pennsylvania.

Putting down roots in a familiar state

Twenty years and several "God-sized assignments" later, the Whitworths continue their ministry to the Pennsylvania/South Jersey

children during that time," said Beth Whitworth.

The small church grew from an average of 18 people to a full congregation of 70-75. The Whitworths' first church assignment was proving to be fruitful.

Struck by change, the original 18 members grew increasingly territorial, posing some "hard" obstacles for the Whitworths. The



region, Barry now serving as the executive director/treasure of the Baptist Resource Network (BRN) and Beth caring for the hearts of pastors' wives as a ministry wives' consultant.

When the Whitworths arrived in Pennsylvania in 2004, it was not their first time doing ministry in the east-central state.

Fresh out of seminary and prior to their days in New York, Barry and Beth traveled to the northwestern most corner of Pennsylvania to help a dying church in Erie.

"We poured out a lot of blood, sweat and tears with our two

Lord eventually led Barry and Beth away from that ministry and, later, closed the doors of that little Erie church.

Upon their return to Pennsylvania in March 2004, Beth recalls visiting Erie, but this time under much different circumstances. There at the little church building that was marred with the pain of their first ministry "failure" was something shiny and new.

There stood a thriving church, Millcreek Community Church.

"I was overcome with joy and tears. God brought alive that

scripture that he would restore what the locusts had eaten and healed so much in my heart,” expressed Beth.

She continued: “For God to just lay his hand over my heart and to tell me all of that had a plan and purpose, all of that had a reason, and we have been able to live long enough and serve long enough to see it, not just hear about it...that was a beautiful time.”

The theme of redemption has continued to thread its way through the Whitworths’ story in Pennsylvania.

Five short years after Dr. Smith offered Barry the regional church

need more across North America and even around the world,” said Whitworth.

On the shoulders of giants

Entering 2009, Whitworth was equipped with passion and excited for a new season of leadership. However, 10 days into this new role, he and Beth found themselves entering an entirely different, and completely unpredictable, season.

A season of cancer. Prompted by not feeling well,

“[I] literally went on to the floor before our Lord and just poured out my heart. I went through all the emotions of grief, every one of them, and within that two-hour period, but God put his arm and his hand over me...that shelter of His wings,” said Beth.

From that day forward, Beth knew the Lord would carry her and Barry through this difficult season.

With every step of the journey, they witnessed God’s faithfulness, from the treatment center in North Carolina located near their daughter’s church to the power of precious prayer warriors.

“I walked through cancer on the shoulders of giants,” said Beth, recalling the prayers of even a missionary in England, who she had never met, that would stop and pray for her every time she would see a Whitworth product in the grocery store.

A season of excitement, turned sorrow, ultimately became a season of strength and trust for the Whitworths. Two qualities they would need for their next “God-sized assignment.”

The executive assignment

planting position, he returned with another offer, this time a state-wide responsibility.

Whitworth had been called up to lead the convention’s church planting team, previously known as the Multiplying Church Team. Being an opportunity aligned with his heart for church planting, Whitworth couldn’t say no to the chance to champion church planting from the state level.

“My journey is and has always been to have a heart for church planting...we need more churches. We need more churches in Pennsylvania/South Jersey. We

Beth scheduled an appointment with her doctor. Several tests later, her diagnosis was clear and confirmed as the far too well-known disease.

“We were hit hard by a tough situation, where we didn’t know whether or not she would even make it,” said Barry.

The early stages of the cancer often prevented Beth from traveling with Barry when he had speaking engagements.

One particular afternoon, when she was home alone, Beth recalls meeting “Jesus on the living room floor.”

At the end of 2016, Barry was, again, faced with a familiar question: Would you consider doing something else? This time, the nostalgic question was followed by the words “executive director.”

“To be honest, I wasn’t looking to do that. We loved church planting, we were enjoying church planting, [but] God said, ‘No, for such a time I want you,’” shared Barry.

Since February 2017, Barry has served, and continues to serve, as the executive director of the Baptist Resource Network.

Over his 20 years of ministry in Pennsylvania/South Jersey, he has



seen more churches planted than those that were already established when he first came to the BRN, noting that nearly 150 churches have been started in the PA/SJ region.

"We've gotten just as many new churches as we have existing churches. It's been a big part of my journey here to be a part of, and [I am] thrilled by God that He allowed us to do this, to see a lot of the nursery work," said Barry, who, because of his experience with starting projects from the ground up, has earned the nickname "the plow boy."

While serving the PA/SJ area, the plow boy has also witnessed answers to numerous prayers, effective changes to the state convention and the addition of like-minded team members.

"Probably the biggest prayer that I think is being answered is happening right now," said Whitworth.

He continued: "When I first started, I said we are going to filter through two things: We're going to filter through the Kingdom and through prayer. I think there's a move happening more and more now, and younger pastors and planters are coming in and their mindset is on Jesus as King, they're not looking to build their own little castle. They're looking to be a part of Kingdom work."

By name, Whitworth mentioned Hal Hopkins, Tim Bailey, John Cope and Joe Velarde as just a few Kingdom-minded pastors and church planters that he's had the pleasure of toiling alongside.

"There's just a lot of young guys now that are helping me become even better at what I'm doing today," complimented Whitworth.

As a source of encouragement, Barry lovingly credits his wife, Beth, as his number one supporter, followed by his family, Dr. Stan

Smith, and ministry giants Jeff Christopherson and Kevin Marsico, just to name a few.

"You don't get 20 years down the road unless you have those type of people," said Whitworth.

He continued: "So, when God sends them to you, don't be annoyed by them or put them aside. Listen to them, respect them [and] love them, because God brought them in your path for a reason, and that reason, mainly, is to make you into everything that God wants you to be moving forward."

Part of Whitworth's current crew of supporters includes his BRN team, a team that he describes as having the "same heartbeat."

"I think we are most successful when our hearts and minds are tuned into everything that Jesus is desiring for what he's wanting to do through us and for our churches... God has blessed me as a leader of the BRN right now to have a team that has that heartbeat," said Whitworth.

Beth echoed Barry's warm thoughts towards the BRN team, recalling a recent meeting where she gazed across the room at all the Pennsylvania/South Jersey pastors who serve as part-time consultants, the BRN staff members, and dear volunteers who serve just because they can.

Through honest tears she shared, "They are getting paid probably a penance of what they deserve, and even less than what our society pays, but they give of their hearts for the Lord, and the rewards have been so great. We have a unity amongst us. All of us are one, one team, around that mission and that heart."

A future worth longing for

The heart of the Baptist Resource Network is to

"accelerate Kingdom movement" in Pennsylvania/South Jersey, a goal that one could suggest as the Whitworth's next "God-sized assignment."

For 20 years, the Whitworths have been embarking on these God-given opportunities one after another in their beloved two-state region, even when those assignments led to new responsibilities and unforeseen battles.

Now, as they look ahead to the years to come, they long for nothing



more than to continue the task of making Jesus known across the PA/SJ region.

"I'm looking forward to seeing that movement that we've all longed for, more people getting saved, disciples making disciples [and] churches raising up more leaders who will start new ministries and new churches," shared Barry.

"I'm excited about the fact that it's starting to happen, and I think we're going to see a whole lot more...and I'm looking forward to it and seeing that happen in the years to come." ■

BRN's Church Health leaders share 2024 highlights

The Church Health team, soon to be known as the Church Advancement team, consists of Dr. Larry Anderson, BRN's director of church advancement and evangelism; David Ludwig, BRN's director of discipleship and leadership development, and six consultants spread across the BRN to serve the pastors and churches. They are Pastor Noelson Chery (Ethnic Consultant), Pastor Josh Coldren (North Central region), Pastor Greg Drayer (West region), Dr. Robert Fontell (Philadelphia region), Pastor Buff McNickle (South Jersey region) and former pastor, Steve Sheldon (Southern Central region).

There were some great successes this year. One of those successes is the number of grants for church evangelism projects that have been awarded. As of early September, 113 churches have received a grant. Another huge success was the Advance Conference, featuring Dr. Mark Croston and Dr. David Wheeler. The BRN also hosted 12 Pastor Blessing events simply to encourage 60 pastors and their families.

Anderson assisted several churches in implementing the *Next Level Blueprint*, facilitated an open discussion on women in ministry, led the Culture Ethics and

Justice Coalition to reconvene to strategize and facilitate unity within our diversity as we approach the upcoming election, and as the Chair of Mansion Hope, he and other BRN pastors were instrumental in seeing Mansion Hope bless the impoverished children within Strawberry Mansion with gifts over the holidays as well as honor and acknowledge the William Dick Elementary School principal and faculty for their service to the children of Strawberry Mansion.

Anderson partnered with the North American Mission Board to bring the ReFresh Conference to Philadelphia to edify and encourage our BRN pastors. He also spoke at several BRN churches to help them celebrate pastoral and church anniversaries and served as a keynote speaker at the FUEL Conference in Philadelphia and as a lecturer for Lifeway at their annual Leadership Conference.

Additionally, David Ludwig provided discipleship training (D-Life Boot Camps) for five churches across the BRN, equipping over 170 people to be disciple-makers. David has also been working with pastors to develop discipleship pathways in their church and helping them to be intentional about leadership development and creating leadership pipelines. David

has coached church planters, pastors, and leaders across the BRN network.

Each of the church health leaders helped churches through transitions, helped churches affiliate with the BRN, and provided pastoral care for struggling pastors. They met with pastors individually and in groups, helped with pulpit supply, and so much more.

Coldren gathered a group of 14 pastors and their wives together to visit Sight & Sound and enjoy a meal together. He helped churches in his region locate an interim pastor and provided support to the congregation through the time of transition. He was able to assist a new pastor with his ordination council and provide counsel to the church through the process. Josh also helped another congregation with an interim during a difficult time.

In the Greater Philadelphia region, our team blessed a group of pastors with a Phillies game at Citizens Bank Park. Also, Fontell preached for churches, provided evangelism training, facilitated a Spiritual Health Assessment, assisted churches in taking their Next Steps, and saw an increase in baptisms because of the large number of evangelism grants distributed for evangelistic outreach events. The Philadelphia region also




saw a successful Send Relief Tour with individuals and churches from across the BRN participating.

Chery held a Pastors Blessings event for ethnic pastors, gathering them together for fellowship and prayer. He encouraged the pastors and prayed with them to see their churches move to the next level. There were discussions with Send Network and visions to start a new church plant in the Southwest Philadelphia area. Chery was also able to assist a church in conflict, resulting in a peaceful outcome.

Sheldon was able to serve as the interim pastor at Fellowship Baptist Church from September 2023-March 2024. He also helped the church secure a new pastor, had lunch with pastors, visited churches, and provided gifts for the pastor's wives.

Drayer participated in gatherings of church planters and pastors in the west, who came together to learn, discuss, and encourage one another, showing the strength of the partnership between the BRN and SEND Network. He also worked with McNickle and pastors across the west to prepare for Serve Erie.

Pastors and wives were blessed with a meal and a time on a Riverboat on the three rivers in Pittsburgh. Also, several pastors gathered together to discuss vision planning and discipleship methods. Through the summer, we have seen about ten churches take a next step by reaching their community through different outreaches and reports of great success and lives being changed through those efforts. One church even had 13 baptisms while having a block party!

McNickle reports that in South Jersey, God has been good and gracious. He had the opportunity to bless many of our pastors with date nights this past year and just hosted an end-of-summer regional cookout for pastors and their families. He has seen the churches impact their communities with the gospel in several ways. They have done community events and outreaches. They have hosted prayer breakfasts, "Hunger Stops Here" events, neighborhood BBQ's and many more events designed to impact their communities. The BRN has been excited to help provide

resources such as grants, materials, programming, and partnering together.

The BRN was also able to resource Delaware Valley East with funding to help start the region's first compassion ministry center. Buff shares that the BRN was able to help celebrate and honor the selfless work and ministry of one of the longest tenured pastors of our region, Pastor Fernando Downs. Downs was one of the pioneers of ministry in South Jersey and helped start and pastor Southside Baptist Church for 39 years. It was the BRN's great honor to attend and celebrate the Downs family at his retirement celebration in December 2023. It was men like Fernando Downs that paved the way for the work here in South Jersey, and we are grateful to continue it.

As you can see, there were many things happening in our churches across the BRN, and as a Church Health Team we are thankful that we could be a part of what God is doing, helping churches be healthy, multiply, and accelerate Kingdom movement.

The communications team at the Baptist Resource Network (BRN) is comprised of Shannon Baker, director of communications and editor of *BRN United*, and Macala Mays, associate editor of *BRN United* and podcast producer, with assistance from Laurel Grimes of BRN's Hub Support.

In addition to producing weekly e-newsletters chock full of the latest news, testimonials, resources and events available to BRN churches, the team has completed several large communications projects this year.

***BRN United* Weekly E-newsletter**

As of October 3, 2024, the BRN has successfully published 40 editions of *BRN United*, including six special editions covering the Annie Armstrong Week of Prayer and Offering, the 2024 SBC annual meeting, 2024 seminary graduates from PA/SJ, the annual #LovePASJ State Missions Offering, a focus on prayer for college campuses, and Serve Erie.

As of July 2024, 83 of our churches have been featured in *BRN United* through articles, feature videos, and the "This Week in the BRN Family" section. We want more churches to send us their news!

Additionally, 165 baptisms have been reported as well as at least a dozen ministry milestones and several stories from six of our campus ministries across PA/SJ.

During this time period, *BRN United* has reached the inboxes of an average of 1,777 readers per week, but we want more subscribers!

New to *BRN United* this year is a monthly column called "Missions Minded," in which Jack Elliot, missions mobilizer for Nehemiah Teams, reflects on the different aspects of missions and encourages churches in their missional efforts.

New sections were also added to the "This Week in the BRN Family" portion of the newsletter, including: "Collegiate Corner" and "Ministry Milestones."

Articles from the newly produced Woven Women newsletter and #TransformPASJ newsletter have also contributed new content to *BRN United* this year.

The communications team worked with BRN's Mary Landis and David Ludwig to produce these two monthly e-newsletters, full of resources and tips for women's ministry, discipleship, leadership development, church revitalization and strengthening, and more.

Podcasts

On the podcasting front, Mays concluded the final episode of the BRN's *Celebrating Cooperative Missions Podcast* on March 28, 2024. This podcast was created at the request of the BRN Executive Board to inform BRN churches and church members of what the Cooperative Program (CP) is and their role in giving to global and local missions.

In April 2024, the *Celebrating Cooperative Missions Podcast* was awarded second place in the audio-visual communications division for overall broadcast/

podcast show at the Baptist Communicators Association's (BCA) 60th Annual Wilmer C. Fields Award Competition. This competition features creative works of all kinds with nearly 250 BCA members eligible to enter. *Celebrating Cooperative Missions* is the BRN's first award-winning podcast.

Communications Projects

Notably, we introduced the new "Your Next Level" conversation starter, which is designed to help churches take their next step in ministry, whatever that step may be, and, ultimately, to help them achieve their next level in ministry. This resource, unveiled at the 2024 Accelerate Conference, focuses on taking God-sized dreams and breaking them into small actionable steps that lead to fulfillment and growth to the next level.

In honor of the centennial anniversary of the Cooperative Program, we also produced a Cooperative Program package with an animated explainer video as well as an explainer booklet and poster. All can be downloaded at brnunited.org/cp.

The team also worked hard to support the #ServePASJ project in Erie, Pa., by designing a full website (servepasj.com) displaying projects, volunteer registration, and other information necessary for participants.

We also produced printed materials and videos for this year's #LovePASJ Week of Prayer and Offering for Missions in Pennsylvania/South Jersey, highlighting collegiate ministry,

compassion ministry, disaster and crisis response, and emergency care for pastors, all areas supported by the offering.

The communications team also designed an online affiliation process that enables interested churches to apply for affiliation to the Baptist Resource Network using an online portal.

We've also produced all the media for our conferences, the Advance Conference, the Amplify Conference, and the Accelerate Conference, as well as the weekly video highlights from Executive Director Barry Whitworth.

And finally, to meet the growing needs of Disaster Relief in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, the communication team developed campaign resources to build a new storage warehouse and ministry center in Winfield, Pennsylvania. The storage warehouse would provide protection from the

environment, as well as provide another space for training and mission team stays, and allow for the continued growth and gospel influence of the disaster relief work in and across our region.

Our team also does all the promotion and registration design for many of the 2024 events and keeps the network's website up-to-date. Bottom Line: we strive to make it as easy as possible for you to find what you need right away!

Other Ministries

The communications team also has been involved in several activities on a national level. In January, Baker and Mays led media workshops at the Southern Baptist Disaster Relief Roundtable in Ogletown, Del.

Baker continues to serve as a reporter for Baptist Press during their annual meetings. This year, she

provided coverage for several of the larger events at the Indianapolis gathering.

She and Mays remain members of BCA, where Macala now is serving as vice president of communications. They both have served on a panel of judges who reviewed entries for BCA's student award competition this year.

Baker continues to serve on an independent group of SBC Cooperative Program advocacy leaders from across various state conventions to prepare prayer resources in commemoration of the Cooperative Program's 100th anniversary in 2025.

Our most exciting efforts have been capturing the stories of our churches all across our BRN family. We are so pleased to share and celebrate with you about what God is doing in your ministries. Please keep sharing!

COMPASSION MINISTRY

Compassion ministry is a key component for any healthy church that is seeking to plant the gospel in the heart of its community. It happens best when you are looking for needs that exist in your context and move you to action. The churches of the Baptist Resource Network have this heart, and it's been an exciting year witnessing our churches getting out and stepping into their communities through compassion ministry. Here are just a few snapshots:

- **FELLOWSHIP CROSSPOINT IN SOUTH JERSEY:** Fellowship CrossPoint hosted a community event called "Hunger Stops" with the aim to end hunger by packing meals to give to those in need. They did this community-wide event that saw people from all walks of life come together to help meet the need. The church not only packed thousands of meals that night but they had intentional gospel conversations and connections with their community.
- **BEDROCK CHURCH FISHTOWN IN PHILADELPHIA:** Bedrock set out to serve and display the love of God to some of the most neglected in the city. They fed, clothed, prayed, and served people all week. The impact of those events saw people give their lives to Christ, get off the streets and into a program, and be reminded they are loved.
- **RESTORED CHURCH IN WILKES-BARRE:** Restored Church invested in their youth by training them over several days and then sending them out to go and engage with the overwhelming poverty that exists in their city. They spent a week serving the city through street evangelism, running a VBS at a local hotel that the county is using to house previously homeless families, and helping another church in the region.
- **FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF CLARION:** First Baptist Church of Clarion planned a stay-at-home mission trip this past summer during which their whole church stepped up and stepped out to serve the city. They went to several areas in the city feeding and inviting families to come to a community event each night in a local park. They capped the week off with a community block party that saw families come from all over the city to enjoy a night of food and fun. The church worked with one of our Network's partners, the Saluda Association in South Carolina, who came and helped build showers in their church for future mission teams to come and help impact the city and the region for years to come.

These are just a few examples of what our churches are doing but there are so many more. BRN churches did creative events, such as "BBQ on the Block," "Unity in the Community," and "Until They All Know." They also handed out coats, food, backpacks, and even fresh produce from a traveling produce truck.

Much emphasis also has been placed on our first #ServePASJ project in Erie, Pa. Stay tuned to learn how God moved in this exciting adventure!





DISASTER & CRISIS RELIEF

Southern Baptist Disaster Relief (DR) is one of the top disaster response organizations in the world because we are able to quickly deploy well trained and experienced volunteers to the point of need and provide logistical support for them. Many disaster relief organizations serve only a humanitarian purpose, but that is not us. We are compelled by Christ's love for all mankind AND his desire that no one should perish. We keep our focus by nurturing our individual relationship with Jesus Christ in the context of a local body of believers who recognize and call out our giftedness in service to God and our neighbors.

THE FOLLOWING ARE BRN DISASTER RELIEF HIGHLIGHTS FOR 2023-2024:

- 24 volunteers received basic DR training in Feeding, Chain Saw, Flood Recovery, and Shower/Laundry
- 72 volunteers have been deployed to 2 in-state responses and 4 out-of-state responses.
- 7 trailers and vehicles have been deployed to the same responses.
- 4 churches have earned Ready Church certificates, and 5 churches have entered the Ready Church certification process.
- 20 Disaster Relief feeding volunteers participated in support of Serve Philly.
- All 3 Shower/Laundry units, the Rapid Response Kitchen, a Western Shelter, and a generator have been utilized to support various ministry efforts of 10 different churches.
- Jeff Slagle donated an F-350 pickup truck, along with a snow plow and a dump bed, to BRN Disaster Relief.
- Three of our Recovery Units have been re-outfitted.

Disaster responses include the winter flooding in Mexico, Maine, a tornado response in Ohio, flooding in West Virginia, the June tornado in Washington County, Pennsylvania, the July 10 flooding in Barre, Vermont, and the August flooding in Potter and Tioga Counties, Pennsylvania.

The BRN Executive Board approved a historic and monumental 3-year campaign to raise \$1.5 million to build and maintain a Disaster Relief Ministry Center on property generously provided by Winfield Baptist Church. Groundbreaking is scheduled for Spring 2025. At the time of writing this report, \$110,000 has been received. (*Scan QR Code on the next page to learn more!*)

The PA/SJ fleet currently includes 2 Mobile Kitchens, 8 Recovery Units (Flood, Chainsaw, Temporary Roofing), 3 Shower/Laundry Units, 1 Command/Communication Unit, 1 Pressure Wash Trailer, 1 Fuel Trailer, 1 Water Purification Unit, 2 Western Shelters, 2 support trailers, a 12-passenger van and a pickup truck. Ownership of these assets belongs to churches, associations, as well as the BRN.

As a result of all of these disasters, the gospel has been presented in each situation to the people who were served. We rejoice that we were able to see God save people through our witness and work. In nearly all cases, we were able to work alongside a local church or church planter to do follow-up and engage local government, residents, and other faith-based and community responders. We praise the Lord for such opportunities to further the Kingdom of God!

Please keep Disaster Relief efforts in your prayers. It is a powerful ministry that brings light into darkness, order into chaos, and Good News into hopeless situations.

FINANCE & OPERATIONS

We have been busy over the past year working on several behind-the-scenes activities that are designed to help enhance the BRN's servicing and resourcing of churches in PA and S. Jersey. Though this is not an exhaustive list, we are happy to share the following.

ABUSE AWARENESS & CLEARANCES TO SERVE

The BRN has been working hard over the past several years to elevate the importance of abuse awareness, training, and clearances/background checks within BRN churches. In Pennsylvania, it is the law for all clergy, staff overseeing the welfare of minors, and volunteers serving with minors to have gone through a clearance process with the state. This clearance process requires a state clearance, PA State Police criminal check, and for some, FBI fingerprinting. Additionally, these PA individuals are required to have Mandatory Reporter Training as they are considered mandated reporters with the state of PA.

In New Jersey, every resident is considered a mandated reporter. The BRN encourages NJ churches to understand what it means to be a mandated reporter and to have at least a state and nationwide criminal check on all clergy, staff, and volunteers working with minors.

When the 2023 Annual Church Profiles were compiled by Lifeway in May 2024, BRN churches scored the highest out of all state conventions related to background checks and child abuse reporting. We are so excited that your church is taking the care and wellbeing of minors seriously!

NEW STATE ANNUAL FILING REQUIREMENT FOR CHURCHES IN PA

Beginning in the calendar year of 2025, annual reports will be required by Pennsylvania. This applies to for-profits and nonprofits. This will apply to all churches and failure to comply could result in an automatic dissolution/termination/cancellation of the organization and loss of the protection of the organization's name, meaning a new organization can come in and take the name previously used by the church.

The annual filing will be free for churches and the deadline will be June 30 each year. The Department of State will mail notice to the registered office address of each church at least two months prior to the respective deadline, reminding it of the need to make an annual report. Please make sure your church's address is up to date with the state. MINISTRY IMPACT FUNDS

At the end of 2023, the BRN executive board began having discussions about creating opportunities for individuals to give directly to the BRN. As a result, we are excited to launch the Ministry Impact Funds of PA/SJ. These funds are designed to strategically increase the Kingdom Impact that BRN churches can have in our region and around the world. This is not a replacement for cooperative missions giving through Cooperative Program, rather it is a way to solicit funds that will assist with servicing and resourcing related to pastoral wellness and care, church health, compassion ministries, the next generation of leaders, church planting, outreach, and administrative support. PASTORAL WELLNESS AND COUNSELING

We were saddened with the news in 2024 that Full Strength Network was closing its doors and would no longer be able to service pastors with counseling and coaching. While the BRN was so excited to provide this resource to pastors for a time, it is time now to find a new solution to help our pastors. We are working hard to find a solution for pastoral wellness related mostly to pastoral counseling. Please join us in prayer that we will be able to find a solution to assist our pastors and families. In the meantime, please be on the look out for pastoral blessing events in your region and don't hesitate to reach out to use the BRN Guest House for a pastor or pastor and wife respite time.

PITTSBURGH MISSION HOUSE

Through a partnership with the South Carolina Baptist Convention and South Carolina churches, we are currently working on renovating the Warren Mission House in Pittsburgh, PA. Under the leadership of Pam and Randy Creamer, teams from churches are working to add additional bathrooms, opening the first floor to be more open concept, updating the paint, flooring, and modernizing the house to the current time. Our hope is that the house will be an even better location for teams to utilize in order to do mission work in the Pittsburgh area. Please help express our appreciation to the Creamers and the SC Baptist Convention. We are so grateful for their sacrifice and willingness!

The BRN is so thankful for you and your generous and gospel minded heart! May we continue to work together to push against the darkness and advance the gospel in PA, S. Jersey, and beyond!

LEGACY PLANNING

Hi, my name is Chuck Knox, and I am the Legacy Coach at BRN. I retired from fulltime ministry in December of 2018. During the last decade of full-time ministry, I traveled nationally presenting Legacy workshops in local churches for a large, national church lending organization. During that time, we helped individuals establish almost \$20 million in legacy gifts to benefit their local churches as well as the ministry that sent me out.

After I retired, I thought my time would be spent with my wife and grandchildren traveling and enjoying what was left of my time on earth. However, God had other plans. Because I had been traveling extensively for almost a decade, we had lost touch with our home church and decided to visit other churches in our area. One of the churches we visited was Harvest Community Church in Kittanning, Pa. It was different than the churches we had attended before but in a good way. They were interested in growing locally but their overall goal was to increase the health and size of God's church everywhere. We identified with that concept and quickly connected and began the process of joining them in their efforts. When the leadership found out my work background, they asked if I would be willing to become a part of the staff and make the Legacy Workshops available in the local church. Harvest is one church in four locations so they wanted to offer the Legacy Workshop to the local congregations as well as other churches in the area. During the four years working part time for Harvest, we provided 13 workshops attended by almost 300 individuals and identified just over \$750,000 in legacy gifts that will benefit Harvest in the coming years.

As a member of BRN, Harvest offered this Legacy Workshop to other members of BRN and at the beginning of 2023, I left Harvest and joined the BRN team on a part-time basis. In the past year and a half, we have presented eight workshops throughout Pennsylvania and South Jersey that were attended by over 150 individuals. Those individuals have indicated that they will be leaving over \$125,000 in Legacy gifts to some of those local churches.



This Legacy Workshop is being offered to all members of the BRN. It is a 90-minute workshop that can be hosted by one church or a group of churches in the same community. Many churches have also found that the

Legacy Workshop can be a great outreach tool to encourage those from outside the church to attend. Included with the workshop is a workbook and a study guide to help answer questions and guide individuals or couples through the process of establishing a godly plan to care for the assets that God has entrusted them with. The workshop is being offered free of charge to all members of BRN. The only expenses that the church is responsible for is the cost of the materials (\$25/set) and all travel expenses.

BRN has also subscribed to an online will drafting program that is offered to everyone that attends the Legacy Workshop free of charge. This way, anyone that attends can create a basic will without cost. All that needs to be done is to input your personal data, print out the documents, sign the documents and have them notarized. It only takes most folks 20 minutes after they have attended to workshop, read through the book, and completed the workbook. They then have a valid will and Power of Attorney to address their concerns and put their plan, rather than that of the state, in place.

Government statistics tell us that only about 30% of those who attend your church actually have any valid end of life documents. That means that 70% of those who attend your services each week are depending on the government to determine how their assets are distributed and who will raise their minor children. No reasonable person can think that is a good idea of plan.

Don't you think it's time to at least offer your congregation the opportunity to change that??? There are still a few dates available for the fall of 2024 and many available after the first of the year. The Lord Jesus Christ opened doors NO ONE could close in a variety of ways to not only encourage those currently serving, but also inspire even more congregations and pastors to explore this mission field.

Highlights of this past year of cooperative ministry include the following experiences and outcomes:

- Over* 2,116 collegians were evangelistically engaged through the collective work of the seven collegiate/Next Gen missionaries and interns serving with them reaching collegians

across our region. (*This reported number reflects only annual data submitted by MSC self-funded BRN missionaries. The balance of activity for this metric represented by church-based and collegiate church plants in particular are not reflected in that number.)

- 53 collegians went on short-term missions opportunities for either their spring break, summer recess, or other short-term missional engagement initiative to engage in evangelistic and community- focused ministry across our state and in foreign countries. A specific highlight of this number are the students who participated in Serve Philly. A commensurate

effort of cooperative ministry reflecting the combined efforts of students from PSU State College, Penn West-Clarion, Penn West California University, Delaware Valley University, and Montgomery County Community College, which targeted Pittsburgh, is also reflected in this number.

- After a pandemic induced short hiatus from in person conferences and retreats, we held our Fall Collegiate Conference at Camp Hebron. Nearly 60 students and their campus ministry directors and missionary leaders shared this weekend of discipleship, fellowship and recreation. Going forward, this event, which targets

collegians and young adults (age 18–29) will be rebranded the *Fall Amplify Conference*. This year, it is scheduled for November 1–3 at Camp Hebron in Halifax, Pa.

- The Lord has added interns who will be serving with Eric Reiber (MSC missionary at PSU State College) as well as with Brady Rennix (MSC collegiate missionary) at Delaware Valley University.


- Our own Brian Musser (MSC missionary serving Drexel University) worked together with other collegiate missionaries from across the BCNET galaxy to complete a resource which will help all kingdom focused congregations be best prepared to complete the as yet

UNFINISHED TASK of taking the Gospel to EVERY CAMPUS in North America. He serves as one of, if not the SOLE voice of SBC-related collegiate missionaries, ministers, chaplains, college pastors, etc. known as EVERY CAMPUS. His work on that team has helped us to surface and visualize for our region the graphic you will find showcased at the Next Gen table display which underscores all of the places in our region where there is still NO GOSPEL witness evidencing the ADVANCE of the Gospel or the ACCELERATION of Kingdom movement on that campus. Perhaps your church is the missing link to that equation of impacting lostness.

If your church has already engaged the Church Health consultants, I welcome the opportunity to explore with you what we believe will be the most significant contribution we

can make to how our churches FINISH the task of reaching every campus in PA and NJ: **The Future Church Pathway**. We believe that this pathway will help all of our churches to be most accurately in touch with the Next Generation in their setting and know best how to take the next steps towards engaging them with the Gospel.

The most significant undertaking we will continue to establish is the Next Gen Missional Engagement Quotient of our network of partnering churches. Shane Pruitt's words from Accelerate 2022 continue to remind us that over 95% of those who trust Christ do so

WOVEN WOMEN

This has been a year of delving deeper for Woven Women: going deeper into the heart of God and deeper into the hearts of the women we serve. From its inception our team has been eager to hear the struggles that women's ministry leaders face in our BRN churches and prayerfully address those needs.

At Accelerate 2023 we gifted women with copies of Julia Higgins book, *Empowered and Equipped*. We offered an introductory training based on Higgins book in late fall at Plaid Community Church. This laid the groundwork for our theme for the seminar, *Empowered: How to Read and Teach Scripture*. We are

in the process of developing an on demand online course on this topic for our BRN women.

In early winter through spring 2024, we rolled out our online *Leadership Development Collectives*. We offered three topical units, "The Skill of Communication," "Time Management and Idea Implementation," and "The Spiritual Disciplines" to women leaders. This was our first experience with developing materials internally, and we learned a lot from this process. Our three Woven Women team leaders facilitated these sessions, which allowed three different scheduling options for participants. Special thanks to Beth Whitworth for conceiving the idea, developing the "Communication" material, and laying out the groundwork for these sessions.

At March's Advance Evangelism Conference, Kimberly Houston and Keith Groves of Macedonia Baptist Church led our breakout session on personal evangelism. They taught real life evangelism strategies they employ in the Norristown, Pa., area when they go out weekly to win the city for Christ.

We have continued to produce our monthly newsletter. We offer this tool to develop and disciple women's ministry leaders, to provide them with resources to use in their own churches, and to invite the unique and inspired perspective

roll out our bi-monthly volunteer training to further develop our team. We are praying and seeking additional volunteers to connect and build relationships with BRN women in several regions, as well as to assist in writing for our newsletter.

We have continued to build and maintain connections with women throughout PA/SJ. This continues to be a slow but steady process of discovering and getting to know all the women engaging in Kingdom work across the BRN. Engaging our women remains the most fulfilling part of this position.

We thank God for all of you. We want to once again thank our wonderful regional volunteers: Crystal Brandon in the Western

region, Cindy Fetty in the Central region, Kimberly Houston in Philadelphia, and Donna Hull in South Jersey. We are grateful to all who have volunteered their time and gifts to Woven Women. To all the women who have taken part in what we offer, and offered us encouragement, we are grateful for you as well. Above all else, we praise God for His vision and leading as we move forward year by year.

P.S. - Once again, I want to offer a very special thanks to Debbie Knowles for her very significant contributions to Woven Women. Debbie, you always have your heart aligned with where God is leading us.

Is Multiplication Optional?

In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus emphatically declared that discipleship/multiplication is not optional. No BRN/SEND church would disagree with Christ's statement. Yet, why is this such a struggle for many churches?

We believe that every church can multiply. We also believe that when a church, regardless of size, sows the seeds of discipleship/multiplication, they will reap a harvest of Kingdom-minded leaders, and some of those God may call to plant churches.

We believe church planting is the most effective strategy for reaching the lost.

- Research indicates that new churches reach more lost people than older more established churches. It shows that a church plant three years old or younger will baptize 10 new believers for every 100 attendees. But a church that is 15 years old or older baptizes fewer than two new believers for every 100 attendees.
- Across 10 denominations, 3,500 churches close their doors every year, while only 4,000 churches are started each year.

Send Network PA/SJ, in partnership with BRN, desires to come alongside church leadership - providing training, leadership development, coaching, and resources in which to assist churches in the multiplication process.

What can a

The purpose of a NC Partnership team is to partner with you in reaching your community for Christ. This could include a direct ministry such as a Backyard Bible Club, sports camp, evangelism, and other outreach activities – OR – one that better equips your church for ministry – such as leadership training or facility construction or renovation.

How much will
having a
Partnership
team cost?

NC Partnership teams pay their own way to the field. They are also prepared to pay their own housing, transportation, and meals *if necessary*. If it's possible for them to stay in your church facility and/or for your church to provide one meal a day for them – that helps greatly, but is not required. Also, evangelistic outreach teams are willing to bring ministry supplies if needed. Construction and renovation-type teams usually expect materials to be provided by the requesting church or organization – although on occasion, they may be willing to contribute toward materials if needed.

How do I go
about requesting
a team from
North Carolina?

Pray about how you might use a volunteer missionary team to assist you in fulfilling your ministry. Fill out one (or more!) of the [electronic request forms](#). It will be automatically sent to Mark Abernathy, Baptists on Mission (BOM). We will be glad to receive requests throughout the year, but most of our churches begin their missions planning 8-10 months in advance, so please submit the request as soon as possible. What happens
then?

Baptists on Mission will work to promote your project among our churches here in North Carolina (and beyond via our website!) and help find a team to fill it. While we cannot guarantee a team to fill your request, we will promote it throughout the year in a variety of ways. When a team shows interest, the team leader will be put in direct contact with you. If you both feel it is a good fit, you both will set the dates of service and work out all the necessary details.

A BAPTIST RESOURCE NETWORK GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ACCELERATE CONFERENCE: The Baptist Resource Network's annual gathering, held each autumn, provides inspiration, training, and encouragement to churches. The conference also hosts a short business meeting to highlight accomplishments and vision.

ADVANCE CONFERENCE: The Baptist Resource Network's annual evangelism conference.

AMPLIFY CONFERENCE: This annual conference focuses on evangelizing, engaging, and equipping the next generation.

ANNIE ARMSTRONG EASTER OFFERING (AAEO): An offering held around Easter to support the field work of the North American Mission Board.

ANNUAL CHURCH PROFILE (ACP): Also known as the annual letter, this is the annual report sent from the local churches to the state convention.

BAPTIST FAITH & MESSAGE (BF&M): The list of beliefs held by Southern Baptists.

COOPERATIVE PROGRAM (CP): Southern Baptists' unified plan of giving through which cooperating Southern Baptist churches give a percentage of their undesignated receipts to support cooperative missions and ministries in the BRN and the SBC.

ETHICS & RELIGIOUS LIBERTY COMMISSION (ERLC): A national entity who addresses specific moral issues in broader cultural conversations.

GREAT COMMISSION BAPTISTS: Great Commission Baptists, affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention, seek to follow God's command to make disciples of all nations.

GUIDESTONE: A SBC entity who provides health insurance, life insurance, retirement accounts, and taxation information as well as wellbeing resources for churches.

INTERNATIONAL MISSION BOARD (IMB): The missionary sending agency of the SBC that deploys outside of North America.

LEGACYPASJ: A fund began in 2021 with the assistance of Ministry Trust (theministryfund.org) to support the Baptist Resource Network's long-term viability.

LIFEWAY CHRISTIAN RESOURCES: The publishing house of the SBC, Lifeway is one of the world's largest providers of Christian resources.

LOTTIE MOON CHRISTMAS OFFERING (LMCO): An offering held around Christmas to support the field work of the International Mission Board.

NORTH AMERICAN MISSION BOARD (NAMB): The missionary sending agency of the SBC that deploys in North America.

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION (WMU): A missions education, prayer support, and involvement organization that also promotes the Annie Armstrong and Lottie Moon offerings.






